

Who Are We?

EMAND is a charity dedicated to helping people with disabilities that require bespoke equipment to help them with their everyday lives. We transform the lives of people with disabilities - of all ages and with all types of disability.

What Do We Do?

EMAND's engineering and design expertise enable us to manufacture bespoke equipment that helps people with disabilities. From two sites in the UK, our team of 20 staff work with individuals to design and manufacture equipment that makes their daily life easier or helps them to enjoy sport and leisure activities. Those with special requirements frequently find there is no 'off-the-shelf' solution. The donations we receive enable us to dedicate the time necessary to design solutions specific to an individual and provide the equipment free of charge.

How Do We Do It?

Our team of designers begin the design process and manufacture a prototype. At the next visit we test to find any unforeseen problems. 

an lives in Hemel Hempstead and has Cerebral Palsy. He has a busy social life and regularly travels around with his carers. Unfortunately, whilst in the car someone has to sit behind him and support his head as it would often fall to the side. DEMAND designed a unique bracket that fits onto the car headrest. The two adjustable side pads support his head and let lan travel and sleep in comfort but still allow good head movement and visibility. Now lan can get out and about more often, as only one carer is needed.

en year old Orla has Epilepsy and Global Developmental Delay. Her parents were worried that she might go into the kitchen unnoticed at home and injure herself or others with utensils, cleaning products, or even burn herself. She had done so in the past and they wanted to make sure it wouldn't happen again. Her parents asked DEMAND for help. A designer from DEMAND visited the home, assessed the situation then designed and fitted a series of safety gates allowing Orla to see and interact with people in the kitchen, yet remain safe from harming herself or others. Her parents are delighted with the result.




enise, from Rotherham, South Yorkshire, approached DEMAND through her Occupational Therapist. She loves watching films but relied on her carers to leave videos out for her. Her needs were very specific since she has a large number of DVD's, videos, cassettes and CDs but because of her limited movement, they had to be presented to her at the right height. We made shelves from clear polycarbonate plastic so they are strong and all the items are visible. They are designed to take all sizes and shapes so that she can choose the order and position of items freely. She is thrilled with the unit we built and the freedom she now has to watch what she wants, when she wants.


saac Johnstone is from Honley in West
Yorkshire. He has Achondroplasia and as he
gets older and more independent, he and his
mother wanted him to be able to wash and use
the toilet himself. They approached DEMAND
through their Occupational Therapist and asked
if we could make Isaac a special access step.
The step we produced can be moved around
and gives Isaac safe access to the toilet and sink
so he can be more independent around the
house.

ennis Conway lives in Netherton, West Yorkshire, and contacted DEMAND through his Physiotherapist. Due to a rugby injury, he is Tetraplegic with limited use of his arms. He needed a mouth pointer to use the television remote control. During the assessment, we discussed his specific requirements then researched the market to find a mouth pointer but none suited. The large diameter wooden pointers we made are lightweight but are big enough for him to move about by 'flicking' his lower arms, a technique he has learnt over the years. We also supplied him bespoke, washable nylon tips for the mouth end that he could grip in his mouth and have further control of the pointer.

heo is car mad: he loves everything about cars, he watches Top Gear, Formula One, loves the Stig and really wants a car for himself! He lives in Tupton, Derbyshire and his mum approached DEMAND to see if we could help Theo achieve his dream. We arranged an assessment with Theo, his mum and his Occupational Therapist to discuss what we could do. Theo's Cerebral Palsy means he needs special support so we agreed to adapt a toy car and modified one of our postural inserts, usually used in push buggies, and mounted it inside the car. We completed the modifications and delivered the car back in time for Theo's 4th Birthday. Both he and his mum are over the moon!

hloe has Cerebral Palsy and lives in Borehamwood. She is only eight but is very independent. Her Occupational Therapist asked DEMAND to produce some weighted children's cutlery for her. Although cutlery like this is available, the size and shape wasn't suitable for Chloe. DEMAND produced a set of bespoke children's cutlery with the exact dimensions needed for Chloe to become even more independent at meal times. When we delivered the cutlery and Chloe tried it for the first time, her ability improved instantly. As you can see from the picture, she loved it.

eah was born with Hemiplegia, which means she has very limited use of one side of her body. The eight year old loves music and wanted to play the trumpet, but she couldn't hold it with her weak hand whilst operating the valves with the other. Her mum asked DEMAND to help. A designer from DEMAND assessed her needs and designed a special stand to support the trumpet in a position that lets Leah play it with one hand. It is fully adjustable and she can play it seated or standing. Leah and her mum are delighted with the result and Leah is making good progress at learning to play.

ynne lives in High Wycombe. She spends the majority of her time in her wheelchair. That doesn't stop her socialising and going out to restaurants, but it is hard for her to sit at a table with her family and friends whilst in the wheelchair. DEMAND were asked to help find a way for her to enjoy meals in the company of others. As a standard tray was too small, a special tray was made for her and she was delighted with the result.



The Foresight to Adapt



Helping Ourselves



he economic climate has been difficult in 2010, with everyone finding it hard to make ends meet: DEMAND was no exception and there was a period when our donated income fell substantially. Rather than wait and hope, we pro-actively looked at how we could diversify our sources of income.

This has taken time to come to fruition but in 2010 we have had modest but increasing success due to several diversification initiatives. It was important that any diversification met the aims of the charity and the two principal ones we identified, RECYCLING and REFURBISHMENT, have the twin benefits of helping more disabled people and generating income.

In the interim the entire staff of DEMAND volunteered to take a 20% to 25% pay cut – effectively working 1 day a week for free.

RECYCLING Many organisations have disability equipment that they no longer require. When donated to DEMAND, it enables us to recycle it, by either re-using materials and components in other projects, or by refurbishing and selling the unit, generating income that helps us continue our core work.

REFURBISHMENT Valuable disability equipment is often stored by organisations but they are unable to re-issue the equipment because they cannot guarantee its condition. Our design and manufacturing skill base enables us to offer a service to receive, clean, inspect, repair and refurbish the equipment before returning it with a guarantee.

In addition, we have started limited manufacture of equipment for sale where there is a substantial need. For example we produce ramps for Boccia, a Paralympic sport similar to bowls. These are sold to both schools and individual players.




Background

Angela has Multiple Sclerosis. Although unable to walk more than a short distance without support, she is capable of riding a bicycle. As a lecturer at Oxford University, she travels between various locations around the campus and depends on her bike to give her independence.





The Challenge

Angela needed to transfer to a walker at the end of each bike journey but was unable to carry a standard walker on her bike due to their size and weight. She therefore needed someone to be available to help her at each location, significantly limiting her independence. She asked DEMAND to devise some way of allowing her to carry a walker on her bike.



A standard walker, even when folded, is too unwieldy for it to be practical to attach to a bike. DEMAND designed a strong but lightweight walker which folds up small enough to fit in a custom-made pannier which attaches to the rack of the bike. When Angela returns home, the pannier, with the walker inside, can be easily detached and taken indoors.

Student Placements & Apprenticeships

Investing In Skills For The Future

EMAND's objectives include encouraging design for disability. Each year we take on students for 48-week placements, at both our sites as junior-designers. The quantity and range of projects we deal with means that they participate in a number of initiatives. As their experience grows, they are given increasingly complex projects and eventually lead the design.

Students take away with them the benefits of incorporating design for disability in everything they do, which helps influence the thinking in their new design environments. Universities rate our placements highly. As a small organisation we provide a complete

overview of the work we do and real projects with real responsibility, meaning it is one of the most rewarding placements on offer. As one of our students said on leaving "It's been a life changing experience".

We have also recently begun an Apprenticeship. In the past our skilled craftsmen have come from the dwindling manufacturing industry but as time goes by we have to consider other ways of securing skills for the future. George Fox (17) joined us in September 2010. In addition to working with us he has formal academic training at college one day a week. The course lasts 2 years.

Geographic Expansion

EMAND's aim is to help as many disabled people as possible, and our strategy for achieving that is geographic expansion.

Our sites in Hertfordshire and Yorkshire give coverage over much of England and we aspire to open a site in Scotland, probably in the M8 corridor.

Expansion requires money and our target is to attract both start up funding and to grow our income so that the larger organisation can be sustained.

In the 5 years since opening a new site in Yorkshire we have more than doubled the number of people we have helped, and greatly increased our "reach" across the country.

We are clear that we can do the same again with further expansion but to do that we need financial support.
