
I am delighted to report that over 3,700 people have benefited from the enabling equipment which passed through our workshops in 2013. This represents an 18% increase compared with the previous year; achieved at virtually no additional cost and despite significant raw material, energy and component price inflation.

The increase in beneficiaries is a cause for celebration on the one hand, and yet at the same time it indicates that too many people with disabilities still come up against barriers to opportunity and experience unnecessary hurdles in their daily lives. **DEMAND** exists to alleviate those problems.



### Kids will be kids

Helping to overcome hurdles early on in life



When a child's equipment works well for them their capabilities are extended.

Take Tadius, a confident 6 year old, paraplegic since birth. His **DEMAND** designed and manufactured madeto-measure steps enable him to get in and out of his wheelchair on his own. The ergonomic handrails also help and encourage Tadius to develop the strength in his arms.


Chelsea has Cerebral Palsy and has difficulty walking. Unfortunately, her old frame did not provide an adequate level of support that would encourage and facilitate walking. The **DEMAND** team designed and fitted a headrest and cross body support which enables Chelsea to properly benefit from her muscle therapy and to be included in other activities with her family and friends.

Our practical solutions, developed under the guidance of qualified health professionals, tackle much more than frustrations with the equipment; influencing the children's sense of self, their confidence and wellbeing.

# **Amber's Story** by her Mum, Rebecca

"Amber was diagnosed with developmental delay, low muscle tone and hypermobility. As a result, we needed to work on improving the strength in her muscles and give her the confidence to walk.

Amber loved moving around in her car walker, but it gave her far too much support and enabled her to sit down whilst moving. **DEMAND** skillfully modified her car with a padded insert for a snug fit and a bar to hold on to for added security, all of which encourage her to stand up to move around. She is slowly gaining confidence and strength in her legs and is able to continue using her much loved toy whilst learning to walk."

Equipment enabling people to get involved




People from all over the world can now participate in leisure and competitive sport using **DEMAND** designed and manufactured kit.

# **Mark's Story** by his friend Stuart

"Mark, a resident of Scope's Birchwood care home in Chesham, has Cerebral Palsy. Hugely determined and big-hearted, Mark is an accomplished artist, fundraiser and Boccia player.

In the early days Mark used a length of drainpipe to guide his Boccia balls during play. Since his interest and skills in the sport have developed, he now uses one of **DEMAND**'s range of purpose designed ramps, which gives him much greater control and precision. **DEMAND's Boccia ramp has** been an important factor in his success in competitions and in January he achieved a bronze medal for his district his best result ever. He is now eligible to play in the National Championship!"



## Going it alone

It's often the little things that give the greatest independence



The design of everyday domestic equipment is often highly disabling. When equipment is inclusively and thoughtfully designed, people can get on with their lives so much better.

Frank likes to be smartly turned out and was extremely frustrated at not being able to iron his own clothes easily. An existing fold-away board, modified to work properly for a wheelchair user, has put him in much more control of his own time and activity.

Freya wanted to transfer from her wheelchair to bed safely, independently and without a hoist. **DEMAND** built a specialist platform that allows her to manoeuvre close to her bed, to park her wheelchair securely, and to transfer from her chair to her bed without extra assistance. This seemingly simple task is hugely frustrating for many wheelchair users. Freya's transfer platform has been truly liberating.

# **Diane's Story** by activities organiser Lynn

"Diane loves to read, but can no longer enjoy this simple pleasure as her Multiple Sclerosis prevents her from using her hands effectively. A friend suggested a Kindle Touch but Diane had difficulty operating that too, and was frustrated at having to rely on others to constantly assist.

As the activities organiser at Diane's home, I knew of **DEMAND** and what they can do. After testing several ideas with Diane they made a cradle for the Kindle to sit in and fitted a switch and a button for Diane to press to turn the page. It is beautifully made and mounted on a small tripod and is a great success. It was a pleasure to meet the team from **DEMAND** who were so patient and understanding of Diane's needs."

## Out and about

Keeping families together when they're on the go



Living with disability often affects family and friends too. Equipment that helps with day to day life, or that opens up previously impossible opportunities, is at the heart of **DEMAND**'s work.

A brain injury left Marie unable to walk unaided. With a baby on the way, she was worried that she would not be able to take her baby out and about easily. Her walking frame, adapted by **DEMAND** to attach securely and detach easily from her buggy, means Marie is now able to take her newborn out for walks and enjoy being a proud new Mum.

Elliott, right, is a wheelchair user, and his little sister struggles to keep up when their mum takes them out. One of our ever popular buggy boards proved just the ticket. Chelsea now gets to ride around like Elliott when they head out together as a family.

"Aiden has been severely disabled since contracting pneumoccocal meningitis when he was only 11 months old. Despite this we try to do as much as possible as a family as we love an adventure!

We have not all been able to cycle together as a family so we contacted **DEMAND** and asked for their help. They made us a lightweight trailer on which Aiden's buggy sits securely. The trailer can be dismantled and fits easily into the boot of our car.

Since **DEMAND** made the trailer we have had lots of fun cycling as a family. Aiden likes the feeling of riding along in the fresh air and we all enjoy the fact we can do an activity together. After a fantastic holiday we are already looking for more trails to explore!"

"Sydney wanted so much to join us at the dinner table, but the specific piece of equipment that would make that possible was only made in the UK and was just too expensive.

Through the internet I came across **DEMAND** and found the exact item had been donated to them. They fully refurbished the chair and ensured it was just right for Sydney's needs, before shipping it all the way out here. Sydney loves it, and now she can eat dinner with us! She is so happy in this chair."

### Tailored to the individual

Helping people's equipment work better for them



Occupational Therapists and Physiotherapists, often our first point of contact on projects, regularly feed back frustration at only being able to recommend a partial solution to a particular problem. At **DEMAND** we develop close working relationships with users and their care networks to produce unique and effective pieces of equipment that truly work for the individual.

Jasmin, left, had an unsuitable tray on her Jenx Suppine frame, and was unable to fully participate at school. Now, with a properly fitting work tray she is able to engage in classroom activities, whilst being safely and securely supported.

Chris had outgrown his favourite walking frame which was too weak to use safely. Extended and strengthened, Chris's walking frame is now safer and much more comfortable which has transformed the way he is able to move around independently.

# **Lisa's Story** by her Occupational Therapist, Stuart

"Lisa's physical disabilities present her with a number of challenges in day to day life; nevertheless Lisa leads a full and active life with a wonderful support network.

Having tried a number of transfer methods, Lisa and I chose a Rotunda Stand which we hoped would negate the need to start hoisting.

Unfortunately, due to Lisa's hip and knee position when standing, the standard knee pad did not provide adequate support and posed a potential increased risk of falls while in use.

**DEMAND** were able to design and build a bespoke knee pad tailored specifically for Lisa which promoted good posture enabling Lisa to maintain a strong standing position.

This perceivably small adaptation has made a huge impact to Lisa's quality of life and those that support her."

## Leisure & Creativity

Everyone has the right to do the activities they enjoy





Living with disability can often restrict the way people are able to express themselves. An art therapy class at a residential home gave a voice to adults with Cerebral Palsy, but the helpers struggled to hold the canvasses in the best positions, or for the length of time required, for the wheelchair-using artists.

The solution was to develop an easel that could be almost infinitely adjustable and hold large and heavy canvasses securely in a way that suited each painter, as shown by Tina, left. When the product's success led to the group requesting another easel, an opportunity to help even more people arose.

Now, after refining the design to make it lighter, stronger, and easier to use, several easels have been produced to give more people with restricted mobility the opportunity to explore their creativity.

Who knows what fantastic work will come of these? Mark's homage to the 'Last Supper', top left, shows what is possible.

"I have been playing trumpet for almost 50 years and this spring I was in a very serious cycling accident which resulted in an injury to my right arm and hand. An internet search found a **DEMAND** YouTube video of a young girl playing trumpet using a monopod and bracket device to support her instrument. I sent an inquiry asking about getting a similar bracket.

After many back and forth emails of measurements and photos I received a beautifully made bracket and monopod which fit perfectly. I am now able to play comfortably using the monopod support. It has made a huge difference to me; music has been my life. I am grateful for **DEMAND**'s concern and skill allowing me to continue to enjoy making music."




Where does **DEMAND**'s funding come from and where does it go?

We work hard to maximise the impact of every penny we receive by keeping tight control on our expenses and making best use of recycled components and materials. Our volunteers provide invaluable fundraising and administrative assistance and our growing band of active supporters, businesses as well as individuals, provide great leverage in the local community.

The generous support of Trusts and Foundations provide 71% of the funds that make our work possible. The rest of our income comes from community fundraising and from selling our own products, such as the Boccia ramps and easels.

A final penny comes from other sources such as reclaiming Gift Aid.


